

"Think of what is above, not of what is on earth." - Colossians 3:2





CELEBRATING EASTER

Easter Sunday is the day we celebrate Jesus' Resurrection. It is the most important day in history.


The whole world changed on Easter Sunday. It was an earth-shattering, life changing, historic event, and the ultimate proof that Jesus truly is God. Catholics have been celebrating Easter Sunday for over 2,000 years.




Easter is more than a one-day celebration; it's an entire season! The time of celebration begins on Easter Sunday and goes all the way through to Pentecost.

As Catholics, the one thing we do more than anything else is celebrate. We celebrate life, death, new life, and eternal life. We celebrate education, innovation, discovery, love, truth, beauty, goodness, forgiveness, reconciliation, unity, family, and new life. We are a people of celebration. And here's the thing—you become what you celebrate. If you celebrate death and destruction, you will become death and destruction. If you celebrate life and creativity, you will become life and creativity. The Church's constant invitation is to celebrate the right things with great vigor, enthusiasm, and regularly.

There are many ways to celebrate Easter. The world celebrates with chocolate eggs, the Easter Bunny, and parties. While Catholics might join in on these festivities, there is much more to the celebration. First and foremost, Catholics celebrate Easter by attending Mass on Easter Sunday or the Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday. Another great way to celebrate is to read the accounts of the Resurrection in the Gospels and spend time in prayer, meditating on the scenes. How would you respond to the empty tomb? Who's the first person you would tell? Third, reflect on how God is inviting you to bring new life into your relationships, your faith, and your community this Easter Season.





EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

SUNDAY IS A DAY OF CHRIST'S RESURRECTION



FROM THE MASS, SOURCE AND SUMMIT OF LIFE

We encounter the risen Christ in the Word of God proclaimed and in the Eucharist we share. During the Eucharistic Prayer, we recall Christ's dying to save us from sin and death and His rising to bring us new and eternal life. "Therefore, O Lord, as we celebrate the memorial of the saving Passion of your Son, His wondrous Resurrection and Ascension into heaven, and as we look forward to His second coming, we offer you in thanksgiving this holy and living sacrifice" (Eucharistic Prayer III).

FROM THE RICHES OF OUR FAITH

Our lives have meaning because Christ rose from the dead. He is alive and present to us in Word, in Sacrament and in His Holy Spirit, who moves and guides us. Sunday is a day to rejoice in new life, eternal life, life in the love of God. We are invited to see every Sunday as a little Easter.

"Jesus rose from the dead 'on the first day of the week.' Because it is the 'first day,' the day of Christ's Resurrection recalls the first creation. Because it is the 'eighth day' following the sabbath, it symbolizes the new creation ushered in by Christ's Resurrection. For Christians it has become the first of all days, the first of all feasts, the Lord's Day" (*CCC*, 2174). "We all gather on the day of the sun, for it is the first day [after the Jewish sabbath, but also the first day] when God, separating matter from darkness, made the world; and on this same day Jesus Christ our Savior rose from the dead" (St. Justin, I Apology 67, PG 6, 429 and 432).

Christ's triumph over death in His glorious Resurrection is the completion and fulfillment of the Old Law. It is, in Sunday worship, the highest and greatest of days, the principle day of obligation for the Christian faithful, and the culmination renewed and re-encountered each week, of the salvation God has wrought in His Son.

St. Luke's Gospel story of the two disciples and their encounter with the risen Jesus on Easter Sunday on the road to Emmaus beautifully connects how we come to know our risen Lord through Mass every Sunday. As the disciples walked and discussed Sacred Scripture with Him they believed Him to be a stranger, but they realized that it was the risen Jesus in the breaking of the bread. Each Sunday our hearts are stirred by Jesus in the word as He prepares us to receive His Real Presence in the Eucharist.

Live It!

- Celebrate Sunday as a little Easter each week by recalling Christ's resurrection and look forward to eternal life in Him.
- In what areas of your life do you need God's new life? Reflect on how God has been present in your life even in difficult times. Look for ways to share these insights with people you know.
- Ask your family and friends: What is something that gives you hope?

SPEAKERS: VICKI AND JORDAN LUCIANO





